Participatory Budgeting (PB) is a democratic process in which community members directly decide how to spend part of a public budget, and helps make budget decisions accessible and clear. PB is a yearlong process of public meetings starting in the fall when community members discuss local needs and projects to meet these needs.

- Budget delegates emerge from the various neighborhood assemblies who then assess hundreds of generated ideas.
- Delegates, in collaboration with City agencies and the City Council, select the most equitable projects that then go onto the PB ballot, culminating in a vote in the spring.
- Eligible voters are 14 years and older and can show proof of residency in the participating district.

The Office of Brooklyn Borough President Eric L. Adams has committed \$1 million in capital funding to leverage the efforts of the Brooklyn City Council members who participate in this process at the council district level.
